Hurricane Michael Debris Collection Schedule - UPDATE

Immediately following the Hurricane, Leon County Public Works teams cleared over 1,100 public and private roadways to ensure that school bus routes and bus stops were safe for students. So far, Leon County and the County's debris contractors have collected 12,871 tons of debris.

56 debris removal trucks and trailers are currently in the field collecting debris in the areas of:

Zone #1: Meridian Road/Meridian Hills, Killearn Lakes, Golden Eagle, Millwood areas

Zone #2: Oakfair, Arendell, and Lafayette Oaks

Zone #3: Buck Lake Road Area/Vineyards

Zone #4: Old Bainbridge Road (North of 27) and Lakeshore area

Zone #5: Riverwood, Hopkins, Lakewood, Pineridge, Sandstone subdivisions

Starting on **Monday, October 22nd**, teams will collect debris in the areas listed below.

Zone #1: Sable Chase, McBride Hills, Arrowhead Estates

Zone #2: Arvah Branch, Midyette Plantation, Hillwood

Zone #3: Groveland Hills, Rhodes Subdivision, Woodville Terrace

Zone #4: Hawks Nest, Bobbin Brook, Lake Jackson Estates

Zone #5: Huntington Estates, Edinburg Estates, Whispering Pines

Leon County will continue to remove debris along public and private roadways according to zones. Upon the completion of the first pass for debris collection county-wide, a second pass will begin by zone. The County's [Emergency Information Portal \(EIP\)](#) will be updated accordingly to provide the latest information on debris removal efforts.

Dedication of the Anita L. Davis Preserve at Lake Henrietta

Earlier this month I had the privilege of taking part of the dedication of the [Anita Davis Preserve at Lake Henrietta](#). Earlier in the year, the County Commission approved the naming of the park for former County Commissioner Anita Davis.

Commissioner Davis served Leon County from 1990-96 and was the first African-American woman to serve on the Commission. During her tenure she led the charge for the construction of

new ballparks in Woodville, the southside library branch, adding an additional health department location and restoring Lake Henrietta.

This new park features a parking area at the trailhead, a 1.2 mile paved walking trail around Lake Henrietta and two (2) wooden bridges that span sections of the lake.


