Hello Rick,

Each year the Leon County Commission has its 'summer recess', a six-week period when we don't schedule regular board meetings. But this time has been anything but a recess:

- In late July I attended the National Association of Counties conference, learning how other counties are addressing public safety, workforce development, homelessness and other policy issues.
- My Chief of Staff and I have been working with Sheriff McNeil and his team on three new business crime watch networks along the North Monroe corridor.
- Working with Robin Hassler Thompson and other antihuman trafficking advocates, we're drafting policy at the FL Association of Counties that, if adopted, will help Florida communities fight labor and sex trafficking.
- Starting my service on the Leon County Research & Development Authority, which promotes economic development at Innovation Park.

Later this afternoon (9/12), the County Commission will have its first meeting of the fall, when we'll conduct final deliberations on the FY23-24 budget, consider a Climate Change resolution, and discuss creating a Miccosukee Canopy Road Greenway Citizens' Committee. During the morning of Sept. 21, we'll have a meeting with North Monroe businesses between Fred George Rd. and Sessions Rd. to establish a new business crime watch network. The meeting will focus on businesses within this specific area, but all interested citizens are welcome to attend. For meeting logistics, please see the info to the left.

Later that afternoon, Blueprint will meet to finalize its FY23-24 budget and whether we will consider adjustments to the Airport Gateway project.

Those are some of the recent and upcoming highlights. If you have any questions or suggestions about these items or others, please don't hesitate to contact me.




