



WIDE OPEN RUSH RULES

OVERALL

No outside assistance is permitted during the event. Racer-to-racer assistance is permitted if both parties are actively participating in the event. Assistance is also permitted from volunteers stationed at each obstacle.

All obstacles must be completed correctly to continue on in the event. If a participant chooses not to complete an obstacle, they can opt to find an obstacle volunteer and perform the designated alternate exercise predetermined by race officials.

Racers are responsible for following the course as marked. It is the responsibility of the racer to know and understand the race route.

All racers must wear an unaltered race number, provided by Wide Open Rush staff, on the **front of their bodies**, at all times. Race numbers must be clearly visible throughout the event, unless stated otherwise by Race Officials. Racers not wearing their number will be removed from the course.

The use of any and all portable media devices, including iPods, is forbidden on the racecourse. Violators will be removed from the racecourse and disqualified from the event.

Racers caught littering the course will be assessed a time penalty and may be disqualified from the event.

Race Management reserves the right to change or alter the course at any time for logistical, weather or safety reasons.

Race Management reserves the right to postpone or cancel the event for any reason.

TIMING

Racers will receive a timing chip at packet pickup and are required to use it according to the directions provided in race packets.

Racers must start with their assigned wave. Racers who do not start as part of their assigned wave will not be given a finish time and will not be listed in the results.

Staging for race start will begin 30 minutes prior to start. Racers need to look for their assigned wave's staging sign within the start area and line up first-come, first-served. Racers must be in the starting chute 5 minutes prior to their wave time.

MEDICAL

Racers have the right to receive basic first-aid and continue the race without being disqualified from the event. Medical personnel have final say as to whether or not a racer is fit to continue the race.

AWARDS

Winners of each group will be named during the Finishers Ceremony at the conclusion of the event.

Winners **MUST** be present to receive the award. No awards will be mailed.

If you have a complaint to file against another racer, you must do so within 15 minutes of your recorded finishing time.

Race Officials have final say as to the outcome of all disputes.
