I. INTRODUCTION

Leon County requests proposals from qualified firms or individuals for professional geology/hydrogeology services to prepare and conduct an Aquifer Vulnerability Assessment of the Floridan Aquifer in Leon County. Section III, Scope of Services provides more detail on the services and deliverables in the project. The overall project area is the geopolitical boundary of Leon County, Florida.

II. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

The ORIGINAL of your reply must be clearly marked "Original" on its face and must contain an original, manual signature of an authorized representative of the responding firm or individual, all other copies may be photocopies.**
- C. Each Vendor shall examine the RFP documents carefully; and, no later than seven (7) calendar days prior to the date for receipt of proposals, he shall make a written request to the Owner for interpretations or corrections of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which he may discover. All interpretations or corrections will be issued as addenda. The County will not be responsible for oral clarifications.
- Only those communications which are in writing from the County may be considered as a duly authorized expression on the behalf of the Board. Also, only those communications from firms which are in writing and signed will be recognized by the Board as duly authorized expressions on behalf of proposers.

- H. The Purchasing Agent will not be responsible for the premature opening of a proposal not properly addressed and identified by Proposal number on the outside of the envelope/package.
- I. It is the Proposers responsibility to assure that the proposal is delivered at the proper time and location. Responses received after the scheduled receipt time will be marked "TOO LATE" and may be returned unopened to the vendor.
- J. The County is not liable for any costs incurred by bidders prior to the issuance of an executed contract.
- K. Firms responding to this RFP must be available for interviews by County staff and/or the Board of County Commissioners.
- L. The contents of the proposal of the successful firm will become part of the contractual obligations.
- M. Proposal must be typed or printed in ink. All corrections made by the Proposer prior to the opening must be initialed and dated by the Proposer. No changes or corrections will be allowed after proposals are opened.
- N. If you are not submitting a proposal, please return the form attached at the end of the RFP, marked 'No Proposal'.
- O. The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all proposals, in whole or in part, when such rejection is in the best interest of the County. Further, the County reserves the right to withdraw this solicitation at any time prior to final award of contract.
- P. Cancellation: The contract may be terminated by the County without cause by giving a minimum of thirty (30) days written notice of intent to terminate. Contract prices must be maintained until the end of the thirty (30) day period. The County may terminate this agreement at any time as a result of the contractor's failure to perform in accordance with these specifications and applicable contract. The County may retain/withhold payment for nonperformance if deemed appropriate to do so by the County.
- Q. Public Entity Crimes Statement: Respondents must complete and submit the enclosed Public Entity Crimes Statement. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- R. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters: The prospective primary participant must certify to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency and meet all other such responsibility matters as contained on the attached certification form.

Every vendor submitting a bid on this invitation for bids **shall** include a copy of the company's local business or occupational license(s) or a written statement on letterhead indicating the reason no license exists. Leon County, Florida-based businesses are required to purchase an Occupational License to conduct business within the County. Vendors residing or based in another state or municipality, but maintaining a physical business facility or representative in Leon County, may also be required to obtain such a license by their own local government entity or by Leon County. If the contractor is operating under a fictitious name as defined in Section 865.09, Florida Statutes, proof of current registration with the Florida Secretary of State **shall be submitted** with the bid. A business formed by an attorney actively licensed to practice law in this state, by a person actively licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation or the Department of Health for the purpose of practicing his or her licensed profession, or by any corporation, partnership, or other commercial entity that is actively organized or registered with the Department of State **shall submit** a copy of the current licensing from the appropriate agency and/or proof of current active status with the Division of Corporations of the State of Florida or such other state as applicable.

Failure to provide the above required documentation may result in the bid being determined as non-responsive.

T. Audits, Records, And Records Retention

The Contractor shall agree:

1. To establish and maintain books, records, and documents (including electronic storage media) in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and practices, which sufficiently and properly reflect all revenues and expenditures of funds provided by the County under this contract.
2. To retain all client records, financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and any other documents (including electronic storage media) pertinent to this contract for a period of five (5) years after termination of the contract, or if an audit has been initiated and audit findings have not been resolved at the end of five (5) years, the records shall be retained until resolution of the audit findings or any litigation which may be based on the terms of this contract.
3. Upon completion or termination of the contract and at the request of the County, the Contractor will cooperate with the County to facilitate the duplication and transfer of any said records or documents during the required retention period as specified in paragraph 1 above.
4. To assure that these records shall be subject at all reasonable times to inspection, review, or audit by Federal, state, or other personnel duly authorized by the County.
5. Persons duly authorized by the County and Federal auditors, pursuant to 45 CFR, Part 92.36(l)(10), shall have full access to and the right to examine any of provider's contract and related records and documents, regardless of the form in which kept, at all reasonable times for as long as records are retained.
6. To include these aforementioned audit and record keeping requirements in all approved subcontracts and assignments.

U. Monitoring

To permit persons duly authorized by the County to inspect any records, papers, documents, facilities, goods, and services of the provider which are relevant to this contract, and interview any clients and employees of the provider to assure the County of satisfactory performance of the terms and conditions of this contract.

Following such evaluation, the County will deliver to the provider a written report of its findings and will include written recommendations with regard to the provider's performance of the terms and conditions of this contract. The provider will correct all noted deficiencies identified by the County within the specified period of time set forth in the recommendations. The provider's failure to correct noted deficiencies may, at the sole and exclusive discretion of the County, result in any one or any combination of the following: (1) the provider being deemed in breach or default of this contract; (2) the withholding of payments to the provider by the County; and (3) the termination of this contract for cause.

V. Local Preference in Purchasing and Contracting

1. Preference in requests for proposals. In purchasing of, or letting of contracts for procurement of, personal property, materials, contractual services, and construction of improvements to real property or existing structures for which a request for proposals is developed with evaluation criteria, a local preference of the total score may be assigned for a local preference, as follows:
 - a) Individuals or firms which have a home office located within Leon, Gadsden, Wakulla, or Jefferson County, and which meet all of the criteria for a local business as set forth in this article, shall be given a preference in the amount of five percent.
 - b) Individuals or firms which do not have a home office located within Leon, Gadsden, Wakulla, or Jefferson County, and which meet all of the criteria for a local business as set forth in this article, shall be given a preference in the amount of three percent.
2. Local business definition. For purposes of this section, "local business" shall mean a business which:
 - a) Has had a fixed office or distribution point located in and having a street address within Leon, Gadsden, Wakulla, or Jefferson County for at least six (6) months immediately prior to the issuance of the request for competitive bids or request for proposals by the County; and
 - b) Holds any business license required by Leon County, and, if applicable, the City of Tallahassee; and
 - c) Is the principal offeror who is a single offeror; a business which is the prime contractor and not a subcontractor; or a partner or joint venturer submitting an offer in conjunction with other businesses.
3. Certification. Any vendor claiming to be a local business as defined, shall so certify in writing to the Purchasing Division. The certification shall provide all necessary information to meet the requirements of above. The Local Vendor Certification Form is enclosed. The purchasing agent shall not be required to verify the accuracy of any such certifications, and shall have the sole discretion to determine if a vendor meets the definition of a "local business."

III. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

A. General Project Description and Introduction:

The Leon County Board of County Commissioners desires to will engage the professional geology/hydrogeology services of a qualified consultant to prepare and conduct an Aquifer Vulnerability Assessment of the Floridan Aquifer in Leon County. The overall project area is the geopolitical boundary of Leon County, Florida.

The outcomes of this project are expressed below in detail but shall include the deliverance of a scientifically defensible, water resource management and protection model outputs. The result of such model development shall enable more focused protection of ground water resources by revealing the more sensitive areas overlying the Floridan aquifer that might require specialized protection through regulation, land use planning and capital infrastructure expenditures. The overall goal of this project and the ultimate development of a regulatory framework, land use planning strategy and capital expenditure program is to minimize adverse impact on the ground water quality of the Floridan Aquifer system in Leon County. The model output will be a map depicting relative vulnerability of the Floridan Aquifer System by geographic area across the project area. A detailed report will accompany the model output.

The Consultant shall provide contract administration that includes, but is not limited to project coordination, review and approval of modifications to the scope of work plan or schedule, and review and approval of invoices. The Consultant reserves the right to contract certain portions of the work known as "contract administration". If needed the County will be responsible for certain portions of the work, including assisting with "in-house" or unoriginal data collection and coordination of the this project with other necessary agencies if necessary.

B Background:

This project originated as a recommendation of the Infrastructure Phasing Report. The Planning Department has defined Infrastructure Phasing as the progressive extension of urban services, specifically, central water and sewer services to all properties within the Urban Services Area (USA) boundary within a specified time frame and the planned extension of the

USA boundary and such services in the future. This entails principles for infrastructure extension as well as a prioritization process for purposes of determining the timing and location of future infrastructure improvements. Primary to these objectives is the protection of Wakulla Springs through the development of environmentally sound wastewater treatment regulations. Secondary to these objectives, is the development of an appropriate response to address septic tank abatement and prevention of the continued development of barriers to future utility expansion.

The Report contained recommendations regarding these two components as well as a funding request for completing an Aquifer Vulnerability Assessment of the Floridan Aquifer (approximately \$73,000). The Infrastructure Phasing Report was accepted by the City Commission on November 9, 2005. The Report was also accepted by the County Commission on January 10, 2006 and funding for this project was authorized on February 14, 2006. This Report contained the following recommendations that are relevant to this project:

1. Financial analysis of providing sewer to the Woodville Rural Community as part of the upcoming Sewer Master Plan update. The Report also recommended linking future sewer extensions and infrastructure investments with the Future densities and intensities provided for on the current Land Use Map. This involves a better understanding of where sewer services are financially feasible in the future and how this matches the development potential provided on the current Future Land Use Map. Providing central sewer to the Woodville Rural Community is anticipated to increase densities and development potential in this area.
2. The Infrastructure Phasing Report also directs sewer retrofit and septic tank abatement efforts to areas of environmental sensitivity first and foremost.
3. Areas of environmental sensitivity where sewer cannot be extended due to lower residential densities or other infeasibilities will need to be evaluated for any negative environmental effects associated with the installation of traditional septic tanks systems. In these areas, more appropriate nitrogen reducing systems may need to be mandated to mitigate any negative impacts.

Current Comprehensive Plan policy also prioritizes sewer extension to areas of environmental sensitivity. However, before central sewer services can be directed to areas of environmental sensitivity or advanced on-site systems can be mandated through the land use planning program or regulatory schema, research mapping must occur that identifies areas of vulnerability where such requirements and expenditures would be justifiable. Such mapping will also provide a better understanding of the potential impacts to Wakulla Springs should increased densities and development occur in the Woodville Rural Community.

The Floridan Aquifer System is the most important source of fresh water in Leon County. All aquifers are vulnerable to contamination to some degree and different areas require different levels of protection. An aquifer vulnerability assessment allows the identification of areas which, based on predictive spatial analysis, are more vulnerable to contamination from land surface.

C. Tasks:

1. Model Development.

The Consultant will prepare an aquifer vulnerability assessment of the Floridan Aquifer System in Leon County, Florida. Vulnerability of the aquifer system is defined as the tendency or likelihood for a contaminant to reach a specified aquifer system after introduction at land surface. This assessment is to be prepared using the same

methodology employed in the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Aquifer Vulnerability Assessment and shall be based entirely in a geographic information system (GIS). The model shall be based upon data from ground water wells (training sites) and input data layers representing the natural hydrologic system combined to yield a probability map representing relative vulnerability of the aquifer system. These input layers may include the following:

- a. Depth to water table
- b. Confinement thickness
- c. Karst features / topographic depressions
- d. Soil type
- e. Vertical leakance
- f. Soil drainage or permeability
- g. Water quality data
- h. Land use data
- i. Flood zone, slope, and current flood control features data
- j. Leon County LIDAR data

Model development shall include the development of a new ground-water quality dataset and a more highly resolved data layer representing aquifer confinement thickness using well boring data. The model shall also incorporate existing light detection and ranging (LIDAR) topographic data (provide by Leon County) to develop refined input data coverages reflecting the LIDAR data.

2. Deliverables:

- a. A written report summarizing the results of the model, recommendations based upon the model, and the methodology employed and the data inputs utilized (deliverable electronically as a Word document and an original high resolution Portable Document Format (pdf));
- b. 5 deliverable compact discs containing all input data as modified for use by the model and all shapefile output from the model;
- c. Complete metadata (including scale and resolution)

3. Initial Project Meeting, Interim Reporting and Project Presentation:

The consultant shall be responsible for conducting an initial project kick-off meeting with the relevant Leon County staff. During that meeting, the Consultant will present the client with an initial project timeline, including milestone dates and estimated project completion date.

The consultant shall also provide a progress report to the Client in written format once per month. This report shall include a description of all work accomplished to date, percentage of total work completed, and estimated time to project completion.

The consultant shall also be available for any presentations deemed necessary by the County regarding the results of model development.

V. SELECTION PROCESS

- A. The County Administrator shall appoint an Evaluation Committee composed of three to five members who will review all proposals received on time, and select one or more firms for interview based on the responses of each proposer. All meetings of Evaluation Committees subsequent to the opening of the solicitation shall be public meetings. Notice of all meetings shall be posted in the Purchasing Division Offices no less than 72 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) and all respondents to the solicitation shall be notified by facsimile or telephone.
- B. The Evaluation Committee will recommend to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), in order of preference (ranking), up to three (3) firms deemed to be most highly qualified to perform the requested services.
- C. The (BCC) will negotiate with the most qualified firm (first ranked firm) for the proposed services at compensation which the BCC determines is fair, competitive, and reasonable for said services.
- D. Should the BCC be unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the firm considered to be fair, competitive and reasonable, negotiations with that firm shall be formally terminated. The County shall then undertake negotiations with the second most qualified firm. Failing accord with the second most qualified firm the Board shall terminate negotiations. The BCC representative shall then undertake negotiations with the third most qualified firm.
- E. Should the County be unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with any of the selected firms, the Board representative shall select additional firms to continue negotiations.

VI. INDEMNIFICATIONS:

The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County from all claims, damages, liabilities, or suits of any nature whatsoever arising out of, because of, or due to the breach of this agreement by the Contractor, its delegates, agents or employees, or due to any act or occurrence of omission or commission of the Contractor, including but not limited to costs and a reasonable attorney's fee. The County may, at its sole option, defend itself or allow the Contractor to provide the defense. The Contractor acknowledges that ten dollars (\$10.00) of the amount paid to the Contractor is sufficient consideration for the Contractor's indemnification of the County.

X. ETHICAL BUSINESS PRACTICES

- A. Gratuities.
