

(3) Temporary signs for public and semipublic events or functions. A non-illuminated temporary sign announcing any public, charitable, educational or religious event, issue or function may be allowed on the site of the sponsoring public, charitable, educational or religious institution and on the site of the event, issue, or function itself. Signs shall not exceed 32 square feet in area. Signs shall not be utilized for more than 60 days.

(4) Temporary signs for new businesses. A new business, or a business in a new location with no permanent signs may obtain a permit for temporary signage of up to 32 square feet in sign area or the maximum permitted sign area allowed for one permanent and/or one wall mounted permanent sign for such occupant, whichever is less, for a period of not more than 60 days or until installation of permanent signs, whichever shall occur first. A temporary ground sign shall not exceed ten feet in height.

(5) Banners, flying paraphernalia, inflatable, sandwich, snipe, and bandit signs A permit may be granted for the use of on-site banners, flying paraphernalia, tethered inflatable signs, sandwich, snipe, and bandit signs for no more than 14 consecutive calendar days in any three-month period, except during the initial opening of a business, in which case a permit may be granted for the initial 14 days (e.g. "grand opening" promotions).

(6) Portable signs. A permit may be granted for the erection of one portable sign on the premises of a business or institution provided that the portable sign shall:

- a. Be allowed for not more than 14 calendar days in any three-month period;
- b. Not exceed forty square feet in sign surface area;
- c. Not utilize flashing illumination;
- d. Not encroach on any right-of-way.

e. Not be placed in a parking space that is required to meet the minimum parking requirements of the county;

f. Not allowed in any residential district.

**DIVISION 3. OFF-SITE OR ADVERTISING SIGNS AND OFF-SITE DIRECTIONAL SIGNS\***

**Sec. 10-1826. Location.**

(a) Off-site or advertising signs shall be located only in the following zoning districts:

- (1) CP—Commercial Parkway District;
- (2) C-2—General Commercial;
- (3) M-1—Light Industrial District;
- (4) I—Industrial District;
- (5) IC—Interchange Commercial District;
- (6) LP—Lake Protection, when located within 100 feet of a principal arterial street and 1,500 feet of an intersection with a principal arterial/minor collector street (or above).

**Sec. 10-1827. Spacing.**

Off-site or advertising signs shall not be placed within 1,500 feet of each other on the same side of the road.
