PATH is a short-term, inpatient crisis stabilization treatment program for indigent persons experiencing a mental health crisis. This program is for adults only. This facility must evaluate Baker Act individuals. Clients admitted will not necessarily be admitted to this program, however, may be referred to Eastside

Psychiatric Hospital, Tallahassee Memorial Behavioral Center, another treatment provider, or be released.

Operating Agency: Apalachee Center, Inc.

Hours/Days: 24-hour inpatient facility.

Eligibility Requirements: Persons meeting the criteria for the Baker Act in need of short-term crisis stabilization.

Fees Charged: Sliding scale. Some Managed Care plans.

Patient Intake: Patients admitted by through evaluation and admissions unit.

The Psychiatric Emergency Response Program (PERP) is designed to provide emergency psychiatric evaluation and treatment to anyone who is experiencing a mental health crisis. To receive services, patients should go to the Emergency Room at Tallahassee Memorial HealthCare and explain the nature of their crisis to the intake staff. Patients evaluated through this program will not necessarily be admitted to Tallahassee Memorial Psychiatric Center. Individuals may be referred to Apalachee Center, Inc. or another treatment facility, or may be released. Persons who are determined to be an immediate danger to themselves or to someone else may be involuntarily detained under the guidelines established by the "Baker Act". While the PERP program will not turn anyone away because of inability to pay, regular emergency room charges do apply. Patients will be billed for the services they receive.

Hours/Days: 24 hours at the Tallahassee Memorial Hospital Emergency Room, 1300 Miccosukee Road, Tallahassee.

Eligibility Requirements: Anyone experiencing a mental health crisis.

Fees Charged: Vary. No one is turned away because of inability to pay. However, Emergency Room charges are billed to the patient.

Patient Intake: Emergency Room.

There must be a history of current use of alcohol or substance abuse at a level and with frequency to have developed tolerance and be at risk of withdrawal if the substance is terminated without medical supervision. The person must not be exhibiting signs/symptoms requiring acute inpatient hospitalization.

Facility works in partnership with local communities to provide services and support for individuals with serious mental illness. All persons who are admitted for services in a state mental health treatment facility must meet the legal criteria contained in either Chapter 394, Florida Statutes (civil or not involved in the court system) or

Chapter 916, F.S. (Forensic or court-involved). Individuals admitted under Chapter 394 have been determined to be at substantial risk for living in the community due to possible dangerousness to themselves or others or the person has refused to care adequately for themselves. People admitted under the forensic statute have been adjudicated through the judicial system to be incompetent to proceed through the court system due to their mental condition or because they have been found by the courts to be not guilty of their crime due to reason of insanity.

Examples of problems addressed include those in danger of children being taken out of home, transition of children being placed back in home, truancy, possible drop-out, and behavior problems. The Center also provides individual, family and marriage counseling therapy. Sliding-scale fees. Psychological testing, gifted testing and case consultation also available.

The FSU Psychology Clinic offers comprehensive services including therapy and assessment for children and adults. Therapy services include individual, group, couples, and family therapy. A wide range of testing and assessment services are available. We specialize in empirically supported treatments. Arrangements need to be made ahead of time for accessibility of wheelchairs after normal business hours. The clinic will assist with insurance filing, but all payment is due up front.

The following are activities/programs available relating to defendants with mental illnesses:

1. In August 1999 the Second Judicial Circuit entered into a cooperative agreement with the public defender, state attorney, sheriffs, police chiefs, Apalachee Center for Human Services, Center for Independent Living of North Florida, and District 2 of the Department of Children and Families to promote the diversion of individuals with misdemeanor offenses and mental health disabilities from the jail to the local civil Baker Act delivery system.
2. In January 2000 the Forensic Mental Health Workgroup was established by Circuit Judge Janet Ferris to review, clarify, and design a process for the provision of mental health forensic services. The specific goals of the workgroup are to redirect and better utilize existing resources to address the problem of defendants with mental illnesses; to provide for better communication between the courts, the Department of Children and Families, mental health providers, etc.; and to address the need for additional resources through future legislative budget requests. Tasks performed by the workgroup include sponsoring training on Florida's Forensic System (September 2000) and the drafting of a proposed administrative order to serve as a protocol for the delivery of services for mentally ill defendants. This workgroup is currently inactive, however, with an increased emphasis on the mentally ill in the judicial process, it is likely that this workgroup will be reactivated.
3. The judiciary, the Leon County Board of County Commissioners, the Department of Children and Families (DCF), the public defender, and mental health providers, are exploring funding options, including grants, to provide an array of activities for defendants in the criminal justice system with a mental illness. Such activities may include training for law enforcement, attorneys, probation officers, judges, etc.; court mental health coordinator to coordinate activities between the courts, jail, and the DCF; probation mental health specialist to provide specialized services; and enhance residential and nonresidential treatment services.

PUBLIC SAFETY COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Leon County Board of County Commissioners voted to establish a Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) in May 2001. The PSCC, as outlined in Florida Statutes, Section 951.26, consists of the following individuals, or their representatives: the State Attorney, the Public Defender, the Chief Circuit Judge, the Chief County Judge, the Sheriff, the State Probation Administrator, the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, the County Probation Director, the Director of a local substance

abuse treatment program, a representative from county and state jobs programs and other community groups who work with offenders and victims.

The PSCC's purpose is to meet regularly and make recommendations of new or existing programs or system enhancements that would help to effectively monitor and manage the County Jail population. A component of this process is to determine the feasibility of diverting mentally ill defendants from the jail.
