The Addressing Coordinate project is designed to develop a comprehensive address database for Leon County.

Specifically, Tallahassee-Leon County GIS, TLC GIS, will be closely working with the Tallahassee-Leon County Planning Department to comply with Option 1 of the LUCA program. Leveraging our current Interlocal GIS Address database, staff with the assistance of part time staff will identify a unique address for each dwelling unit in Tallahassee and Leon County. In addition, each identified address will be geo-referenced within the GIS database in order to maintain their spatial integrity.


8. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Tallahassee-Leon County Planning Department is the lead entity for the City of Tallahassee and Leon County for Census activity. They have requested that Tallahassee-Leon County GIS take the lead on creating a comprehensive and complete list of addresses for each dwelling unit within Leon County. This will allow for a quick and comprehensive comparison of addresses as outlined in LUCA's Option 1. Tallahassee-Leon County GIS has already begun to review all single family dwelling units (approximately 80% complete). However, it has been determined that extensive field work will be required to resolve conflicts identified as part of the within the single family review and to complete multi-family residential properties and mobile home developments. The funding requested will be utilized to complete these efforts.
