Cameron Yarbrough is a Governmental Consultant with the Tallahassee office of Akerman Senterfitt, Attorneys at Law. His career began in 1998 as Legislative Aide to Florida Senator Jack Latvala. He served as State Coordinator for the Florida Mock Election for more than 600 public and private schools in a comprehensive voting and education program under Florida Secretary of State Sandra B. Mortham. In 1998-1999 Cameron was a Special Assistant for the Transition Team for Governor Jeb Bush. He also served as a Governmental Analyst in the Executive Office of Governor where he was responsible for key legislation tracking and management, constituent correspondence, meetings with constituents and special interest groups on substantive and budget issues, organized legislative bill signings, coordinated the Governor's daily briefings on pending and passed legislation, and reviewed all legislative proposals for the Executive agencies.

Cameron previously served as the Legislative Liaison for the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. He dealt with myriad issues including oversight of Florida Regulated Business and Professions, hospitality, sale of alcoholic beverages & tobacco, pari-mutuel wagering, construction, real estate & development, condominiums, and timeshares.

In 2001 he became the Legislative Director for the Department of Management Services, where he supervised the Department's legislative agenda. This experience has left Mr. Yarbrough with an extensive knowledge in the program areas of the Department, including insurance, retirement, state purchasing, state facilities and building construction, and human resource management. He has served as an evaluation and negotiation team member for invitations to negotiate and requests for proposals, most recently for the administrative services contract for the state's health insurance. He also served as project manager for certain Department initiatives, including energy conservation, outsourcing of security for state facilities, and food services for the Capitol.

Mr. Yarbrough has a vast knowledge of the legislative and executive process and brings valuable contacts and resources to the legislative and regulatory team.

Mr. Yarbrough has a current active Real Estate License and is a candidate for his commercial CCIM designation in Florida. Along with his wife of nine years and two children he has lived in Tallahassee for fourteen years.


