


Dear Chairman Rackleff,

2010-2011 Dori Slosberg Fund Proposals

Leon County Schools Goals:

1. Leon County Schools will employ 2 full time certified driver's education instructors. These two employees will assist with on the road driving experiences at (6) public high schools.
2. We will use Slosberg funds to assist with the up-keep and maintenance of the driver education vehicles.
3. We will purchase additional materials for student on the road driving experiences. We will purchase as many materials as funding will allow.

2009-2010 Summary Report

Summary of Expenditures:

Leon County Board of Commissioners awarded Leon County Schools \$154,492 from the Dori Slosberg funds for behind the wheel driver's education instruction. Leon County used these funds to hire (2) two on the road driving instructors to rotate on a daily basis among five (6) public high schools (Chiles, Godby, Leon, Lincoln, Rickards, and S.A.I.L.). Additionally, Leon County used these funds to assist with the maintaining of the fleet of vehicles, and to assist the Leon County Sheriff's Office with the "Teen Driving Challenge Program".

Exact expenditures are as follows:

• Teacher's annual salary (including benefits)	\$146,475.00
• Teacher's summer salary (including benefits)	\$5,842.33
• "Teen Driving Challenge Program" LCSO	\$2,000.00
• Vehicle repairs	\$174.67
TOTAL	\$154,492.00

Program Evaluation:

- Students at (6) six public high Schools received on the road driving experiences from a certified driver's education instructor.
- A total of 869 students benefited from on the road driving experiences.
- Operator license waivers were assigned to 699 qualified student drivers.

- 81% of the students that experienced on the road driving instruction received a Department of Motor Vehicle operator's license waiver.
- Each student received an average of 70 minutes of on the road driving time.
- All eligible students in Leon County were provided the opportunity to experience the LCSO "Teen Driving Challenge Program".
