I am Christopher Kennard Weaver from Pompano Beach, Florida. I graduated with a B.S. in Criminal Justice with a minor in Political Science from Florida A&M University. I am currently pursuing a master's degree in Political Science from Florida A&M University while working as a behavioral specialist for the Leon County School board. While attending Florida A&M University, I served as the Student Government Association Supreme Court Chief Justice, Supreme Court Associate Chief Justice, and Traffic Court Associate Justice. Through these positions I was constitutionally appointed to a number of student leadership advisory boards which included the University Presidential Search Committee for one year, the Student Body Constitution Reform Committee for 2 years, and the Election Commission for one year.
