Notice is hereby given that Leon County, Florida will conduct a public hearing on Thursday, June 16, 2011, 9:00AM at Leon County Health & Human Services, Community Room, 918 Railroad Avenue, Tallahassee, Florida 32310 to obtain public comments on the proposed application to the Florida Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for a FY2011 Small Cities Community Development Grant (CDBG).

Leon County is considering applying to the Florida Department of Community Affairs for a FY 2011 Small Cities Community Development Block Grant of up to Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000). These funds must be used for one of the following purposes:

- 1. To benefit low to moderate income persons;
- 2. To aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight; or
- 3. To meet other community needs of recent origin having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community and where other financial resources are not available to meet such need.

The categories of activities for which these funds may be used are in the area of housing, neighborhood revitalization, commercial revitalization or economic development and include such improvement activities as acquisition of real property, loans to private for-profit businesses, purchase of machinery and equipment, construction of infrastructure, rehabilitation of housing and commercial structures, and energy conservation. Additional information regarding the range of activities that may be undertaken will be provided at the public hearing. For each activity that is proposed, at least 70% of the funds must benefit low and moderate income persons.

In developing an application for submission to DCA, Leon County must plan to minimize displacement of persons as a result of planned CDBG activities. In addition, Leon County is required to develop a plan to assist displaced persons.

All interested parties are invited to present their comments at the public hearing at the time and place set out above. The Public Hearing is being conducted in a handicapped accessible location. Any handicapped person requiring an interpreter for the hearing or visually impaired should contact Mr. Lanham at least five (5) calendar days prior to the meeting and an interpreter will be provided. Any non-English speaking person wishing to attend the public hearing should contact Mr. Lanham at least five (5) calendar days prior to the meeting and a language interpreter will be provided. Any handicapped persons requiring special accommodations should contact Mr. Lanham at least five (5) calendar days prior to the meeting.
