

Leon County Saves First, Spends Second:

NEARLY \$100 MILLION

Since 2013



Long before recent conversations about government efficiency gained widespread attention, Leon County has maintained a longstanding commitment to responsible fiscal stewardship. Through year-round operational efficiencies and innovative practices, Leon County realized nearly \$100 million in cost savings while continuing to deliver essential services.

In November, Florida voters will consider a constitutional amendment that would significantly change the property tax revenues that fund county services. Whatever voters decide, Leon County's commitment to stretching every dollar will continue.

THE BOTTOM LINE

Nearly \$100 million saved or avoided since 2013: more than \$71 million in direct cost savings and avoidances, plus more than \$28 million in recurring savings from employee-driven innovations. All of it while holding the countywide millage rate at 8.3144 for 15 straight years. Every dollar saved or avoided is a dollar that doesn't have to come from taxpayers.
