Public Safety Complex Grand Opening: July 11

Leon County and the City of Tallahassee have made a commitment to helping save lives in our community. With the building of the new Public Safety Complex, a number of key operations will now be located in one facility including the Emergency Communications Center, Leon County Emergency Medical Services, Tallahassee Fire Department Administration, the City of Tallahassee Regional Transportation Management Center and the Leon County Emergency Operations Center.

Perhaps most importantly, the public safety dispatchers for all services will now work together in the same facility. This helps ensure that when assistance is needed, the closest and most appropriate unit – whether it be Fire, Police, Sheriff or EMS – will be sent. And in emergencies, those seconds can help save lives.

Please attend the grand opening for this new, major enhancement to the community at **10 a.m.** on **Thursday, July 11.** Tours will be offered starting at 10:30 a.m. Emergency responders will be on site to answer questions and provide unique insight about the facility.

Capture the Light: Energy-Efficient Lighting Options for Residences

Who: This program is for all Leon County citizens who are interested in saving energy and money in their home lighting.

What: "Capture the Light: Energy-efficient Lighting Options for Residences," as part of a quarterly series of programs hosted by the Leon County Library System and the Leon County Office of Sustainability entitled, "Community Matters: Topics of Interest for a Sustainable Community."

The program will consist of informal lectures with question and answer periods, an opportunity to examine examples of efficient lighting products, and free light refreshments.

In celebration of sunny summer days, Leon County is sponsoring two free "Capture the Light" programs to inform residents about energy-saving ideas for lighting, including ways to capture natural daylight and a survey of the new generation of LED (light emitting diode) and CFLs (compact fluorescent lights).
