Installation & Reorganization of the Board of County Commissioners



The Leon County Board of County Commissioners held its 2014 Installation and Reorganization of the Board Ceremony on Tuesday, November 18, in the Commission Chambers of the Leon County Courthouse.

Re-elected District 1 Commissioner Bill Proctor, District 3 Commissioner John E. Dailey, District 5 Commissioner Kristin Dozier, and At-Large Commissioner Nick Maddox were sworn in by Chief Judge Charles Francis.

Clerk of the Court Bob Inzer swore in At-Large Commissioner Mary Ann Lindley as Chairman, and District 1 Commissioner Bill Proctor was selected as Vice-Chairman. For the next year, Chairman Lindley will serve as the official representative of the Board, leading official meetings and signing resolutions on the Board's behalf. One of her first tasks will be to preside over the Board's Annual Strategic Planning Retreat on Monday, December 8, at Goodwood Museum & Gardens, where the Board will discuss ongoing challenges facing the County. During this annual longterm strategy session, Commissioners will discuss and recommend revisions to the Board's Strategic Plan, which focuses upon the Economy, Environment, Quality of Life, and Governance.

Adopt-A-Tree

Leon County is proud to offer the 2015 Adopt-A-Tree public tree planting program. If you live inside Leon County, but outside of Tallahassee city limits, you may qualify to have a Mayhaw planted on your property for free. The Mayhaw is a small, native, spring-flowering tree.

If you agree to water the tree three times a week for one year, Leon County Public Works will plant the tree anywhere between your house and any publicly-maintained road or any privately

maintained road with public access. To have a tree planted on your property between February and March 2015, simply fill out an application online at **www.LeonCountyFL.gov/AdoptATree** and place a wooden stake at the desired location. Public Works will try to get as close to the designated area as possible. One tree per household per year will be planted.

The application deadline is Saturday, January 31, 2015.
