### Tire'd of Mosquitoes? Ditch old tires at Amnesty Event

Tire'd of mosquitoes? In an effort to prevent breeding grounds for mosquitoes, Leon County Government will host an Amnesty Day for citizens to drop off tires for free. The event will be on **Saturday, April 27 and Saturday, May 18 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Leon County Fleet Management, 1800-1 N. Blair Stone Road**. All Leon County citizens who bring a valid ID verifying their County residence can participate.

It is important for waste tires to be disposed of properly because unused tires collect water and create ideal breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes. Residents may dispose of up to 25 passenger car tires free of charge. Commercial

loads will not be accepted.

The event will feature a short presentation followed by a panel of experts who will share their unique perspectives on topics: the economic impact of the Red Hills conservation lands in Leon County, allowable development in rural lands with a specific emphasis on regulations concerning agritourism, the unique qualities of the Big Bend Scenic Byway, and the importance of canopy roads to the character and economy of Leon County.


