

Tire'd of mosquitoes? In an effort to prevent breeding grounds for mosquitoes, Leon County Government will host an Amnesty Day for citizens to drop off tires for free. The event will be on Saturday, May 18, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Leon County Fleet Management, 1800-1 N. Blair Stone Road. All Leon County citizens who bring a valid ID verifying their County residence can participate.

It is important for waste tires to be disposed of properly because unused tires col-

lect water and create ideal breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes.

Residents may dispose of up to 25 passenger car tires free of charge. Commercial

loads will not be accepted.


