Two days ago, your County and City Commissions had a joint workshop to discuss the upcoming revisions to Leon County's Comprehensive Plan. Over the next several months, we'll focus specifically on changes to the land use and mobility element of the plan.

The decisions our community makes during this process will affect Leon County for years to come. The stakes are high, and I'm committed to ensuring that you and everyone living in Leon County are provided with clear information in an open, transparent way. During the workshop, for example, I said one of our highest priorities should be to clearly articulate each proposed change and to explain the purpose behind each revision.

It is also critically important that we hear from you. During March and April there will be ten public workshops and open houses, where you and other Leon County citizens can learn more about the proposals and provide feedback. Dates and locations for these meetings are provided here and in the section below. If at all possible, please attend one or more of these meetings. I'm planning to attend several of them myself.
