Upcoming Virtual Meeting and Public Hearings Tuesday, April 28 at 3:00 pm



The public can view live coverage of the April 28th Commission meeting on Comcast channel 16 or steam it live through the Leon County's <u>Facebook</u> page, <u>Youtube channel</u> or on the Leon County <u>website</u>. Public comment will be accepted via electronic submission. Citizens wishing to provide input for this meeting may submit their comments at <u>Leoncountyfl.gov/PublicComments</u>. To ensure adequate time for Commissioner review, comments should be submitted by **8 p.m. this evening (April 27, 2020)**. Comments will be distributed to the Commissioners prior to the April 28, 2020 3 p.m. meeting. Comments submitted after the 8 p.m. deadline will be added to the official record of the meeting, but the County

Local Emergency Assistance for Non-profits (LEAN) Grant



At its most recent meeting, the Blueprint Intergovernmental Agency (IA) Board of Directors, comprised of <u>Leon County Commissioners</u> and <u>City of Tallahassee Commissioners</u>, activated a \$1 million grant program to assist local non-profits impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Local Emergency Assistance for Non-profits (LEAN) grant program, which will be administered by the <u>Tallahassee-Leon County Office of Economic Vitality</u> (OEV), was initiated by the IA Board through the reallocation of \$1 million from the Blueprint infrastructure program to provide a helping hand to eligible, local non-profit organizations in order to support the continuity of their operations.

Eligible non-profits include human services, cultural arts and historical organizations. To date, OEV has received more than 129 applications and has approved \$222,500 for 89 eligible applicants.

The application deadline is Friday, May 15, 2020, or until all funds have been expended, whichever comes first. The funds will be released to eligible non-profits on a first-come, first-served basis. Non-profit organizations receiving grant approval should expect to receive payment approximately 10-12 business days after submitting the necessary forms.

North Monroe Street Resurfacing to be Accelerated

Certain Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) infrastructure projects are being accelerated during the COVID-19 pandemic, since traffic is lighter due to safer-at-home orders. Blueprint staff recently met with FDOT staff via conference call and learned that FDOT would accelerate the resurfacing of North Monroe Street from the Gadsden County line to Capital Circle NW/Old Bainbridge Road. To that end, the project will be out for bid by October 2020, ahead of schedule.



Leon County Crime Down for Third Consecutive Year!

The Leon County Sheriff's Office recently announced a decrease in the overall crime rate in Leon County for the third consecutive year.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement's 2019 Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) shows a 13.7% reduction in total crime from 2018. Along with that overall statistic, UCR also reflects a

reduction in violent crime by 6.4% and a reduction in property-related crime by 14.9% over the same reporting period. As a result, Leon County no longer has the highest per capita crime rate in the state. Moreover, Leon County has seen a 32% decrease in total crime since 2016.



We still have a lot of work do (and COVID-19 presents new challenges), but this is a testament to the leadership of Sheriff <u>Walt McNeil</u> and his team, the <u>Tallahassee Police Department</u>, and of course the public.

Beware of Covid-19 Text Scams

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) is warning citizens about text scams related to COVID-19. Recently, the BBB has gotten numerous reports of phony text messages claiming to be from a government agency.



How the Scam Works:

You get a text message that looks like it comes from the US federal government, such as the US Department of Health and Human Services. The message tells you that you must take a "mandatory online COVID-19 test" and has a link to a website. Other text message scams include urging recipients to complete "the census" or fill out an online application in order to receive their stimulus check.

No matter what the message says, do not click! These texts are phishing for personal information. They also can download malware to your device, which opens you up to risk for identity theft.

Tips to Spot a COVID-19 Text Message Scam:

- Government agencies do not typically communicate through text messages.
- Ignore instructions to text "STOP" or "NO" to prevent future texts. This is a common ploy by scammers to confirm they have a real, active phone number.
- If you think your text message is real, be sure it's directing to a web address like "agency.gov" or "agency.ca," not "agency.otherwebsite.com."
- Check for look-alikes. Be sure to do your research and see if a government agency or
 organization actually exists. Find contact info on your own and call them to be sure the person
 you've heard from is legitimate.

COVID-19 Testing

If you are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), you should call your primary care doctor or local health care provider before visiting a doctor's office. Your doctor or local healthcare provider will determine if you need to be tested. A drive-through sample collection site has been established at the Northwood Center for patients who have had an order sent from a physician. In order to get tested at this testing center, you must have a medical referral. Learn more HERE.

FAMU Bragg Stadium also has a walk-up COVID-19 testing site. The site, which is being hosted especially for residents of Tallahassee's southside, is scheduled to operate for 14 consecutive days from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. Organizers plan to conduct 200 tests per day. Testing is free and open to the public. No physician referral is required. Learn more <u>HERE</u>.

These fun events will be streaming live from the LeRoy Collins Leon County Public Library Facebook page.




Virtual Local Author Storytime
