

Dear Friends:

Recently we've seen an uptick in the number of fatal accidents in our area involving cyclists and pedestrians. Making streets safer for drivers and pedestrians is a critical need for our community to thrive and the county is moving in the right direction.

Over the past month we've taken action

to improve street safety, including some key sidewalk projects in District Five. I asked that a segment of Apalachee Parkway be vetted for the County's Sidewalk Priority List. The County's Sidewalk Priority List ranks requested sidewalk segments from Tier 1 (the most critical) to Tier 4. We fund these projects with \$2.7 million each year, with a total of \$13 million since the program started.


Major Developments & Construction Projects Portal
