Law Enforcement Mental Health Response

The Consolidated Dispatch Agency (CDA) coordinates with Mental Health Responders from the Leon County Sheriff's Office and the City of Tallahassee's Emergency Assessment Mobile Unit (TEAM) to provide crisis intervention and assessments for individuals experiencing non-violent mental or behavioral crisis, and emergency behavioral health services in accordance with the Baker Act.



Apalachee Center Mobile Response Team (MRT)

The Apalachee Center's Mobile Response Team is a 24/7 on-call crisis intervention service providing emergency behavioral health assessments and diversion alternatives to inpatient treatment. Services are provided through phone consultations and on-site response by Mobile Response Team clinicians.
