

Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQG)

Are businesses, government, schools, church, and non-profit entities that:

- Produce less than 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month
- Produce less than 2.2 pounds of acute or severely hazardous waste per month
- Accumulate less than 2,200 pounds of hazardous waste per year.

They can dispose of hazardous wastes by appointment at the Leon County Hazardous Waste Center by appointment, and fees below will apply. Please prepare an inventory of materials and amounts prior to arrival. US-EPA listed Small Quantity Generators (SQG) and Large Quantity Generators (LQG) are not eligible.

Packing hazardous waste for transport

We have prepared the following suggestions to help VSQG customers pack hazardous materials for transport to the Hazardous Waste Center. Please call ahead to make an appointment. Normally, we can provide same-day acceptance. We reserve the right to turn away VSQG customers without an appointment. Some materials cannot be accepted and staff will provide alternative waste streams for those items.

1. Prepare an inventory of material to be transported. This will help us to sort materials and will assist responders if you have an accident while in route.
2. Place containers in a box to contain any spills. Please do not loosely pack items in a garbage bag. Items can easily spill and bags frequently leak. Customer may be asked to unpack loose bags of material.
3. Place like materials together. Separate unlike materials. Pool chemicals should not be transported with other materials.
4. Make sure containers are tightly sealed.
5. If a container is leaking, place it into a larger container like a coffee can or bucket, preferably one that can be sealed. Large zipper bags are also very effective at containing leaks.
6. When possible, please label materials that are not in their original containers or that have lost their original label.
7. Fluorescent lamps can easily break. The best way to transport them is in their original packaging. If not in original package, tape or tie groups of tubes together and wrap with some kind of protective padding. Loose compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) should be wrapped in padding, such as paper towels. If you have large numbers, the Hazardous Waste Center can provide boxes upon request. Do not pack CFLs in the same container with heavy items such as batteries.
8. Transport containers in the trunk of your car, in the bed of a pickup truck, in the cargo area of a box truck/trailer or a open trailer. Remove other items from transport units.
9. For your safety, please transport flammable liquids like gasoline in DOT approved containers. Please limit gasoline in small containers to 10 gallons per visit. If fuel or oil is transported in steel drums, they must be closed-top, in good shape and have properly fitting bungs so that they can be shipped as-is.
10. Any other drums used for transport must be in good condition and properly sealed.
11. Overall, use of drums is discouraged due to weight and transport hazards.
12. The Hazardous Waste Center does not supply or replace drums.
13. For ease of unloading and weighing, keep electronics separate.
14. Please properly secure all loads to prevent shifting during transit.
