From the Library Director

In October 2014, I worked part-time at the library in Youth Services. I will never forget the overwhelming feeling my first day because the sheer number of books that were placed in front of me made my head spin. It was exhilarating and a little frightening. How in the world could I possibly read them all? How could I recommend to others what to read? How could I get those enticing titles and book covers out of my dreams?

As crazy as this may seem, the Fall season evokes a desire to read for me. I don't know if it has something to do with the longer days, or just a reset to routine. I have loved stories my entire life, but for some reason I can get so busy that I must carve out the time to just relax and read. If you find yourself having the same problem, here are three tips:

1. Select a few titles. If you find that a story isn't sticking, then try a new one. It is hard to commit time to a story that isn't keeping your attention. It is okay to put that book down.



- 2. Set a reading time for yourself. I have committed to 30 minutes five nights a week; however, I find myself reading for about an hour every night. If time is a problem, set your goal to a few chapters.
- 3. Select a space that feeds your reading passion. I don't like to read in bed, because it means that I will never go to sleep. I have a favorite chair that I usually fold myself into with a little dog that makes herself at home on my lap.
