There's a lot to look forward to in 2023. We're so glad you're a member!



Friendshop Breaks Records in 2022

The numbers are in, and the Friends of the Library have plenty to celebrate, courtesy of the Friendshop. Readers may recall that 2019 was a record year for the Friendshop, with nearly \$65,000 in sales. No longer. In 2022, Friendshop manager Deitra Kemmer and her dedicated staff shattered that record, posting nearly \$77,000 in sales--an increase of almost \$12,000 amounting to an 18.5% year-on-year increase. Together with the continued support of our members, it is the Friendshop staff's hard work and blue-ribbon customer service that enable the Friends to give fulsome support to the Library's programs.

Visitors to the Main Branch Friendshop will also notice that the Friendshop has changed over from its previous point-of-sale system to a new Square terminal. The new system not only streamlines the customer experience but also results in savings of about \$200 per month -- an amount that can now go directly toward the Friends' mission.
