

Section B2 – Projects Underway

Some of the projects listed in Section B1 of this proposal are still underway. The Frenchtown drainage project is completed and as-built surveys have also been completed. The Eastern half of the project is over 50% constructed and the effort to as-built the new structures has not yet begun. This project will likely be completed within four weeks of the submittal date for this proposal. There is another phase of this project to be awarded, which may or may not involve Meridian Surveying and Mapping Inc, depending on who is awarded the contract.

In addition, Meridian has another sizeable project underway South of Orange Avenue, along Wahnish Way. This is the Emory Court drainage project, which will be underway for quite some time. It involves reconstruction of a large creek, installation of multiple drainage structures, and as-built surveying upon completion of the construction. Meridian currently has personnel working on this project about one or two days per week in order to stay ahead of the contractor.

Ghazvini Medical Center is completed as far as the construction layout portion of the project. The asbuilt survey effort will begin when the building contractor finishes the construction on the building and the parking garage. This project required two crew days per week up until the construction layout portion was completed about two months ago.

In addition to the projects listed above, Meridian has several local engineers and realtors who utilize our services to complete small topographic and boundary projects, normally less than \$1,000.00 in fees each.

With several of our major projects nearing completion, this is a good time for Meridian to acquire this new contract with Leon County.



Section B3 - Procedures for Assurance of Design Standards & Q/C

Meridian Surveying and Mapping Inc. has several advantages over the larger firms in regards to understanding the scope of a project, accuracy of field data collection and quality control for the finished, signed/sealed survey produces. In most every instance, the licensed land surveyor and/or the senior cadd technician assigned to the project will be the person meeting the Leon County staff to discuss the project details, determine the scope of services, and outline the field crew on the project assignment. By eliminating layers of management or out of town project managers, there is less chance of mistakes in regards to the specific instructions received from the client.

In addition, there are no projects currently being completed at Meridian Surveying Inc. where the signing surveyor or senior technicians have never visited the project site. Meridian follows the industry standard q/c process of redlining errors on a survey drawing, then marking them off in green as they are corrected. Once the final draft of the survey drawing is completed, it is taken to the field for an on-site walk through. Any final discrepancies are noted and returned to the office for correction.

Over the three years that Meridian has been in business, we have saved our clients countless hours in return trips to the field due to the close communication between all of our staff, and the intimate knowledge of each project by Steve Stinson and Eric Wills, the signing surveyor and senior technician.



Section B5 – Basic and Special Resources

Meridian Surveying and Mapping Inc. has made every effort to hire well-qualified, dependable personnel and provide them with the latest, most advanced survey equipment. Meridian currently owns three Topcon Total Stations, including two robotic stations and one conventional instrument. We have found that in most cases, the robotic total stations will collect far more data over the course of a work day than the conventional instrument. For this reason, we utilize the robotic equipment on all open projects, whether they involve construction layout or collection of topographic survey data.

The exception to the higher productivity with the robotic survey equipment is heavily wooded projects. Through experience, we have found it necessary to use a standard total station when collecting data on large tree surveys or other heavily wooded sites. All of our survey crew personnel have been trained on every piece of survey equipment currently owned by Meridian and can operate efficiently with a minimum amount of guidance.

Our final surveys are produced in an Autocadd format, compatible with the design standards currently being used by most every engineering design firm or municipality in the Leon County area. Meridian can build digital terrain models, create contour lines, or produce topographic surveys to the specifications determined necessary by the Leon County staff.

Section C - Willingness to Meet Schedule and Budget Requirements

One of the projects listed in Section A2 of this proposal is the as-built survey completed on Victoria Grand apartments here in Tallahassee. This was one of the very first projects of substantial size that Meridian Surveying completed. In this instance, the previous surveyor on the project was from out of town. The client had already paid the original surveyor for the completion of the as-built survey and allowed him the time to complete the task, but he refused to come back to town or return the clients telephone calls.

Consequently, Meridian's first large scale project was over budget and behind schedule before we ever set foot on the project site. By working with our client, the project owner, and the project engineer, and the City of Tallahassee staff, we were able to get the as-built survey completed, reviewed and accepted by the City of Tallahassee in a very short time. Since the completion of this project, Meridian Surveying Inc. has received and completed thirty (30) more projects for this same client.

By showing this same type of commitment to all of our clients, Meridian has been able to not just survive, but in fact grow in the dire economic conditions in our area since 2007.

Budget:

In regards to determining budgets or fees for proposed projects, both Steve Stinson and Eric Wills have the legal authority to bind Meridian to a contract. On nearly every project where there is a well defined scope of services, Meridian will be able to quote a lump-sum price for the survey work to be completed. All of our quotes are given in writing in the form of a proposal letter, followed up by a contract signed after the basics of the project have been determined and agreed to by both Meridian and the client.

On any project, there exists the possibility of changes to the Scope of Services. When these instances arise, Meridian will communicate with the client to receive written permission in advance of additions or deletions to the original Scope of Services and/or the original fees.

Schedule:

With the currently-existing personnel and equipment, Meridian can field between 1 and 3 survey crews. The abilities of our staff and their familiarity with all of our equipment allow us to adjust to the scheduling demands of our clients. To date, Meridian has been able to deliver complete, accurate products to all of our clients, many times on short notice. Meridian will communicate scheduling issues clearly with Leon County Staff, including any adjustments necessary due to scope changes, rain delays, or other unforeseen circumstances.

Section F - Approach To The Project

Residing in close proximity to the Leon County Engineering office location on Miccosukee Road will allow Meridian to respond quickly to requests from the Leon County staff regarding meetings, project scopes or other related issues. Meridian's standard approach to a project starts by meeting with the clients project manager to gain a basic understanding of the survey needs and formulate a cost effective solution.

On projects other than very simple survey tasks, Meridian would prefer to meet with the Project Manager on the project site, so that existing conditions can be reviewed as necessary to correct drainage issues, collect additional topographic information or otherwise refine the project scope of services to meet the needs of the Client.

Once a written scope of services and a firm fee estimate has been completed, Meridian will immediately schedule a field crew to begin collecting the field data on the project site. The Survey Crew Chief will have, in his possession, a copy of the written scope of services, along with any maps, existing plans or other information provided by the client. As the field work progresses, one of the two owners of Meridian Surveying Inc. will visit the field crew on site to be sure that the project is being completed in an accurate and cost effective manner.

Upon completion of the field survey effort, the data will be downloaded and the cadd files created to the specifications determined by the client. Any irregularities will be clarified by communicating with the Survey Crew Chief assigned to the project and a draft version of the final drawing will be produced. A Q/C review will be completed on the draft survey, and any necessary corrections will be made. A jobsite walkthrough will be conducted with the draft survey in hand by either Steve Stinson or Eric Wills to note and correct any final discrepancies.

Once our Q/C process has been completed, the specified number of hard copies will be signed and sealed, then delivered to the Leon County Engineering offices along with an electronic file in an Autocadd format.
